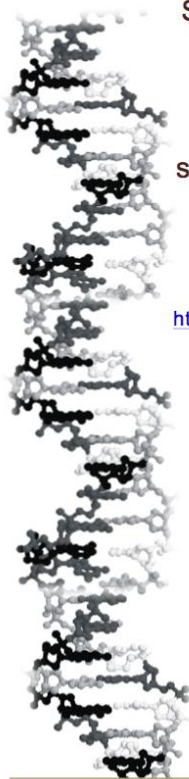

Dr. Jeanette Jones received her PhD in Medical Mycology from The Ohio State University in 1976. In 1975, Jones was listed in World's Women Who's Who and in 1978 she was named an Outstanding Young Woman of America. Jones has received several distinguished accolades from the Beta Beta Beta National Biological Honor Society and the Significant Service Award from the NASA Space Life Sciences Training Program. In 2003, the National Institutes of Health gave her its Extramural Associate Research Development Award. At Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University, she has been bestowed the Outstanding Leadership Award, the Resolution for Distinguished Service from the Board of Trustees, and was named Woman of the Year in 2006. She has been appointed to the U.S. Army Science Board since 1994 by the Secretary of the Army. Dr. Jones is also a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated.

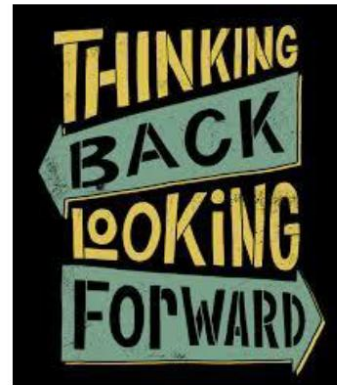

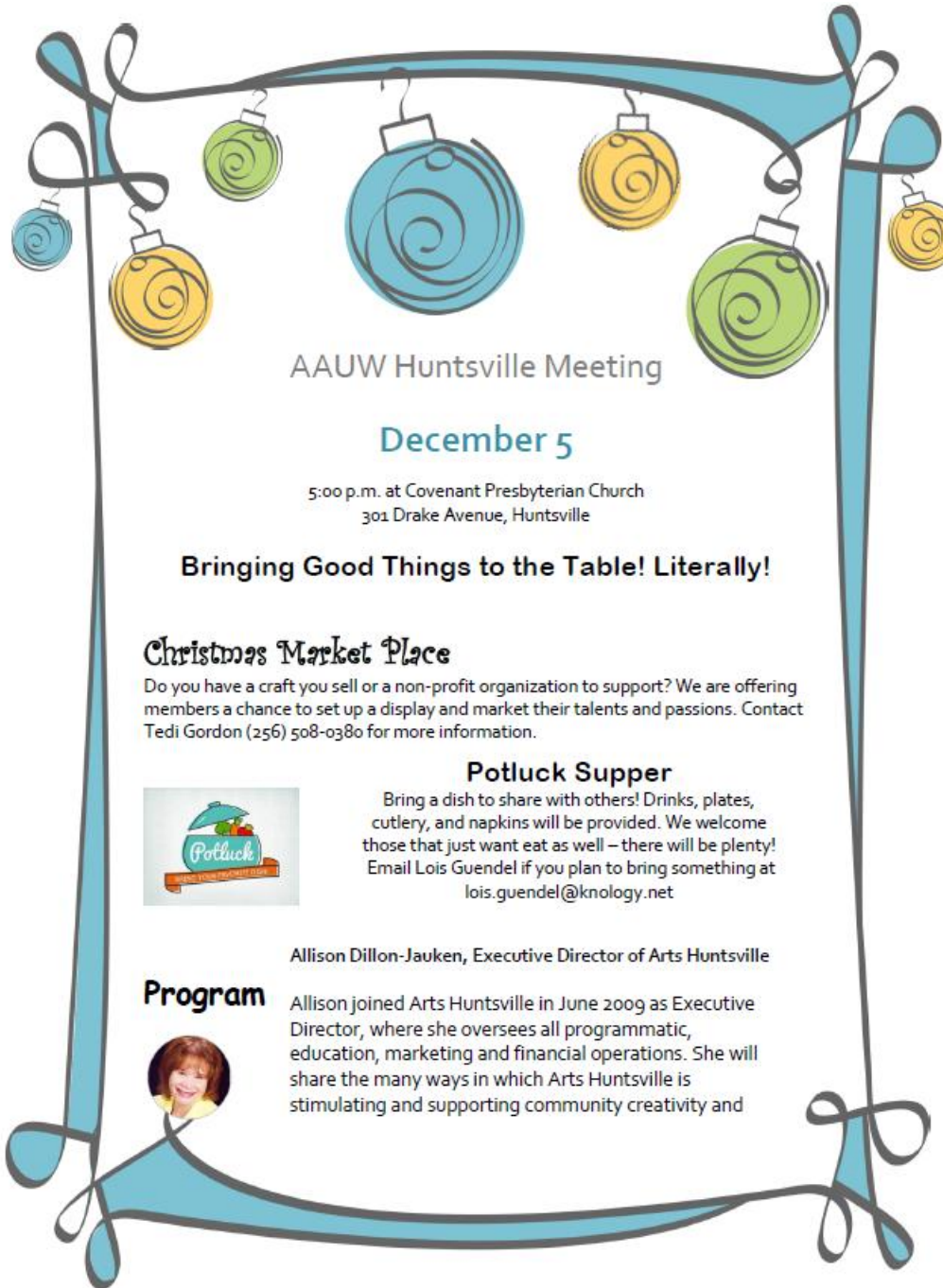
